Maths	Design an 'Olympic Archery Target' with coloured rings (use an empty cereal box or a piece of paper). The target has 10 concentric circles that score 10 to 1 from the smallest ring scoring 10 and the outer ring scoring 1. Use a coin or a counter and take turns to flick your counter towards the target board. After each turn, keep a record of your scores. After each player has had ten turns, add up your scores. The highest total wins.

Writing	Watch the clip https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jA6Y7gG3OLs Select a number of sports and write a set of instructions to explain the rules of the sport, how it was played and won. Remember to organise your writing with sub-headings.	
Wider Curriculum	At the Olympics opening ceremony , athletes and officials from each participating country paraded in the Olympic Stadium preceded by their flag . Your task is to select a country and research the meaning behind their flag. Present your findings in a format of your choice.	
Challenge	The official logo for the Olympic Games in five interlocking rings which represent every colour found on the national flags of the countries which competed at that time. It is to remind us of how we are connected and that we can gain strength from each other through sport. The motto for the Olympic Games is 'Citius Altius Fortius' which is Latin for 'Faster, Higher, Stronger.' Design a personal motto which demonstrates your core values.
