<p><b>Maths</b></p> 	<p>Column Addition</p> <p>We have been learning column addition. We have to partition the numbers first into tens and ones before we work out the answer. Can you work out the answers to these sums? Remember you may need to carry in some of the sums!</p> $15 + 12 = \quad 10 + 22 = \quad 51 + 25 =$ $34 + 27 = \quad 47 + 29 = \quad 72 + 18 =$ $24 + 39 = \quad 47 + 48 = \quad 65 + 26 =$ <p>Challenge: Write some of your own column addition sums for someone living with you. Work out the answers before them to see if they have answered them correctly. If they have answered it wrong can you explain how to do it?</p> <p>This week practice your 2 times tables. Remember you can use Times Table Rockstars or Hit the Button!</p>
