<u>The Academy Day</u>

The academy day begins at 8.30am (doors open at 8.00 am for breakfast club) and ends at 3.00pm for children in Reception and Key Stage 1 and 3.05pm for Key Stage 2.

Morning Nursery and our 2 year old provision runs from 8.30am (flexible drop off time from 8.30am - 8.45am) until 11.30am. Afternoon Nursery runs from 12.15pm until 3.15pm (flexible pick up time from 3.00pm - 3.15pm).

Children who attend Nursery for 30 hour provision will attend full days Monday to Thursday and then Friday morning session only finishing at 12.30.

Daily timings are as follows:

2 Year old provision 8.30am—11.30am

Nursery am: 8.30am—11.30am

Nursery pm: 12.15pm-3.15pm

Reception, Year 1 and 2: 8.30am—3.00pm

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6: 8.30am—3.05pm



<u>Attendance</u>

Good attendance at school is not just valuable, it's essential. Children who miss school frequently can fall behind with their work and make less progress than their peers. It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. Please can you continue to support the academy by ensuring children have good attendance and are on time.

Attendance and punctuality will continue to be a key priority for Brambles Primary Academy this year. This year we will be continuing to reward the children for attendance through Class Dojo, which then allows the children to choose prizes when they reach benchmark numbers of points.

Please can we remind all parents that if you take your child on holiday during term time then a leave of absence form must be completed. The 'working together to improve school attendance' DFE guidance supports schools with attendance and states the following:

'As head teachers should only grant a leave of absence in exceptional circumstances it is unlikely a leave of absence will be granted for the purpose of a family holiday.'

Therefore, if you choose to take your child out of the academy for a family holiday . this may be unauthorised and may lead to a fixed penalty fine.

<u>Reading and homework</u>

All children should have a book bag and books are checked daily and changed on a regular basis.

Please ensure that you update your child's reading record as

they read so that we can reward them in the academy for their efforts.

The academy have purchased a range of books and these will be used as a reward for children who read 50 times this term.

Homework will be given out to pupils on Mondays. This could be a paper activity or using a variety of learning platforms including Timestable Rockstars. Please support your child with completing these homework tasks by Friday as these tasks will support your child's learning.

<u>School Dinners</u>

Where school dinners are paid for, this year the cost is £12 per week. The cost should be paid on a Monday for the week ahead and can be paid either by cash directly to the office staff or via SchoolComms.

Likewise any Educational Trips which require a contribution can also be paid via SchoolComms or through cash to the office.

<u>Uniform</u>

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- Navy blue cardigan or jumper
- Pale blue shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Black or grey trousers/skirt/pinafore or
- Blue and grey tartan skirt/pinafore (contact Lollipops)
- Plain ankle or knee length socks or plain tights
- Blue or white checked or striped summer dresses may be worn in the summer months
