Bikes and scooters

Naming Clothes and Lost Property

Many children misplace their personal possessions, and we are constantly finding lost property. Please help by ensuring that **ALL** property and items of clothing and footwear are clearly marked with your child's name.

Academy staff can not search for missing items of clothing if they have not been clearly labelled.

At the end of each half term, all unlabelled uniform will be placed out on the Key Stage 1 playground for collection. Following this time, all left over uniform will be added to the wardrobes for children to borrow.

Uniform

- Navy blue cardigan or jumper

- Plain ankle or knee length socks or plain tights
- Blue or white checked or striped summer dresses may be worn in the summer months

Shoes

- Flat, black school shoes. No trainers or heelies.
- In the summer, children may wear flat supportive sandals with socks. They should be black, white or navy

Hair

- Hair should not be dyed or cut into extreme styles.
- Only small, school coloured bows are allowed.
- Hair past the shoulder should be tied up.

Nail Varnish

 Nail varnish is not permitted in school for health and safety reasons, if a child has nail varnish on from the weekend or holidays we can provide facilities to remove it.

School Dinners

Where school dinners are paid for, this year the cost is £12 per week. The cost should be paid on a Monday for the week ahead and can be paid either by cash directly to the office staff or via School Comms.

We have recently changed our provider for our school dinners and are really excited about moving forward with Aspens. Our new menus will be available online like the previous and our kitchen staff continue to work hard every day to provide nutritious and tasty meals for the children.

Likewise any Educational Trips which require a contribution can also be paid via School Comms or through cash to the office.
